**MINUTES – SUPERVISOR’S MEETING – April 6, 2020**  
9:00 am Constantia Town Hall

**CALL TO ORDER:**

At 9:05 am Mr. Mosley called the meeting to order with the pledge of allegiance. Mr. Metzger is joining the meeting via Zoom, Mr. Colesante is joining via conference call.

**HIGHWAY:**

Mr. Woolridge wanted to discuss bringing the highway employees back to work, they have been out for two weeks with pay. Mr. Woolridge called them back today they will be working summer hours, 4 – 10 hour days. Mr. Woolridge is asking if the board is okay with his decision. Mr. Woolridge told the board that he believes the County will be calling back their highway employees on Monday the 13<sup>th</sup> not sure if employees will be on shifts or how they will work it. The Town has 5 men, Mr. Woolridge will be having each take their temperature at the beginning of each shift. Mr. Colesante questioned if they are essential employees, why were they sent home to begin with. Mr. Woolridge indicated that it was unknown at the beginning with the Gov. Cuomo’s order so he sent them home just to be sure. The major concern is if anyone gets sick the entire crew is lost during possible quarantine. After discussion the following was decided:

Colesante: Follow what County is doing

Metzger: Follow what County is doing

Tomaino: Mr. Woolridge should decide if safe they should work

Moran: Mr. Woolridge should decide, take precautions

Mosley: Mr. Woolridge should decide – stay on top of guidelines and follow precautions

**DUMPSTER DAYS:**

Question is if dumpster days should be cancelled. Mr. Metzger thinks it is too early to decide, Mr. Mosley wants to put this out to bid to get at least 2 container companies. Mr. Woolridge would like to cancel or at least postpone at this time. After discussion, should dumpster days be held in May?

Moran: No

Tomaino: No should be held bi-annually

Mosley: No

Colesante: Yes

Metzger: Abstain – too early to decide

**PARK ROOF – BIDS:**

At the March 17<sup>th</sup> town board meeting the bids were open for the replacement of the bathhouse roof at the David C. Webb Memorial Park at Taft Bay. Unlimited Construction, Gary Suter was the low bidder but had payment requirements listed that the Town does not follow, Mr. Mosley was to contact Mr. Suter to see if he would accept the bid with the Town’s normal pay schedule. Mr. Mosley has not reached out to Mr. Suter as of yet, with this in mind Mr. Colesante made the motion to award the bid to Unlimited Construction for \$12,000.00 if payment terms are agreed upon and proper insurance is given, if Unlimited Construction cannot meet those terms the bid should be given to the next low bid E.S. Stone Contracting for \$12,300.00, seconded by Mr. Moran.

**TOWN CLERK:**

With all clinics cancelled and veterinarian office’s open for emergencies only, Mrs. Haynes asked the board if they are in agreement with waiting to send out renewals. The board members agreed to wait on mailing license renewals at this time.

Mrs. Haynes has been questioned as to Board of Appeals and Planning Board meetings – All meetings are on hold until further notice.

An email was received about the basketball hoops at the Town park, the board is in agreement to leave them up at this time.

All agreed to pay the one hourly employee at the town hall for their normal hours.
